Act No. 26 of 1972

AN ACT to provide for the Incorporation of a body to be known as the Soroptimist Club of Port-of-Spain.

[Assented to 2nd October, 1972]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago a body known as the Soroptimist Club of Port-of-Spain from January, 1959. Preamble

And whereas it is expedient that this Club should be incorporated for the purposes of giving it a legal identity.

- Enactment** BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
- Short title** 1. This Act may be cited as the Soroptimist Club of Port-of-Spain (Incorporation) Act, 1972.
- Incorporation** 2. The Organisation known as "The Soroptimist Club of Port-of-Spain" shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession and may sue and be sued in the Courts of Justice in Trinidad and Tobago by that name and shall have and shall use a common seal which may from time to time be changed in accordance with the rules of the said body corporate. The said body corporate is hereinafter referred to in this Act as "The Club".
- Aims and Objects** 3. The aims and objects of the Soroptimist Club of Port-of-Spain are as follows:—
- (a) To maintain high ethical standards in business and professional life;
 - (b) To advance the status of women;
 - (c) To develop a spirit of friendship and unity among Soroptimist of all Countries;
 - (d) To quicken the spirit of service and human understanding;
 - (e) To contribute to international understanding.
- The Club may acquire and transfer property** 4. The Club shall have power:—
- (a) to acquire by purchase, exchange gift, bequest, devise or otherwise all messuages, lands, tenements and hereditaments of any tenure and also all moneys, security for money, goods or chattels whatsoever and may hold and enjoy the same;
 - (b) to accept surrenders and reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
 - (c) to sue, demise, grant, convey mortgage reconvey, surrender, exchange or otherwise dispose of all or any property from time to time vested in it.

5. All documents requiring the seal of the Soroptimist Club of Port-of-Spain shall be sealed with the common seal of the Club in the presence of the President and a Vice-President and General Secretary of the Club for the time being in office who shall sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal of the Club was duly affixed.

6. The Club shall at all times have a permanent address in Trinidad and Tobago for service of documents on the Club and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Club may be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

7. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty the Queen her Heirs and Successors or any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons, except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
