Act No. 30 of 1971

AN ACT to validate the appointment in the Public Service of Arthur Marshall, a former daily-paid Checker, Ministry of Works, and to provide for the payment of superannuation benefits to the said Arthur Marshall.

[Assented to 12th November, 1971]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, ^{Enactment} by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Pensions (Arthur ^{Short title} Marshall) Act, 1971.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary:—

- (a) Arthur Marshall, a former daily-paid Checker, Ministry of Works, shall be deemed to have been appointed substantively to the post of Departmental Clerk Class II (since re-designated Clerk I), Ministry of Labour, with effect from 26th April, 1966;
- (b) there shall be paid from the Consolidated Fund to the said Arthur Marshall a gratuity of three thousand, three hundred and sixty-six dollars and sixty-nine cents and a reduced pension with effect from the 12th day of December, 1968, at the rate of eight hundred and eight dollars and one cent per annum.
