TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO
Act No. 19 of 1968

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the "Trinidad and Tobago Petroleum Dealers Association" and matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 8th July, 1968]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago an Association known as the "Trinidad and Tobago Petroleum Dealers Association" (hereinafter referred to as "the Association"). Preamble

And Whereas it is expedient that the said Association should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Trinidad and Tobago Petroleum Dealers Association (Incorporation) Act, 1968.

Incorporation of the Association

2. The Association known as the "Trinidad and Tobago Petroleum Dealers Association" shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in Trinidad and Tobago by that name and shall have and use a Common Seal with power from time to time to change such Seal.

Power to make rules

3. The Association may make Rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions.

Powers of the Association

4. The Association shall have power—

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraints, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired title thereto, to sell, demise, grant, convey, mortgage, reconvey, surrender, exchange, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all or any property which are now or may from time to time be vested in or have been acquired by it.

Mode of Execution of Documents

5. All deeds, documents, or other instruments requiring the seal of the Association shall be sealed with the common seal of the "Trinidad and Tobago Petroleum Dealers Association" in the presence of two members of the Executive, who shall sign every such deed, document or other instrument to which the common seal is affixed, and such signing

shall be sufficient evidence that such seal was duly and properly affixed, and that it is the lawful seal of the Association.

6. The "Association" shall at all times have a permanent address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Association may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

7. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her heirs or Successors, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
