Act No. 17 of 1969

AN ACT for the Incorporation of Trinidad and Tobago
Association for Mental Health

[Assented to 4th June, 1969]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and ^{Preamble} Tobago an Association known as the Trinidad and Tobago Association for Mental Health:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Association should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment	BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows: —
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as the Trinidad and Tobago Association for Mental Health (Incorporation) Act, 1969.
Incorporation	2. The Association known as "The Trinidad and Tobago Association for Mental Health" (in this Act referred to as "the Association") is hereby created a body corporate and may sell, exchange, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being, be vested in or have been acquired by it.
Constitution and powers of Board	3. The Governing Body of the Association shall be its Executive Committee which shall consist of a President and such number of persons as is provided for in its Constitution; and subject to any provision therein shall have and exercise all powers of management of the affairs of the Association.
Mode of execution of documents	4. All documents requiring the seal of the Association shall be sealed with its common seal in the presence of the President and the Secretary who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be <i>prima facie</i> evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and the same is the lawful seal of the Association.
Registration of address for service of documents and method of service	5. (1) The Association shall at all times have a permanent address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General. (2) Any document may be served on the Association by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the address as registered under subsection (1).
Saving of Crown and other rights	6. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
