TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO
Act No. 34 of 1968

AN ACT to provide for the Incorporation of a body known
as "Divine Army of the New Creation".

[Assented to 22nd October, 1968]

WHEREAS there has been for many years established in
Trinidad and Tobago a religious association known as the
"Divine Army of the New Creation".

An whereas the said religious association operates in
Trinidad and Tobago under the name of Divine Army of
the New Creation Garfield Osbourne of Caparo Village,
Caparo by virtue of his office of Pastor and Lawrence

Superville of 64, Prince Street, Port-of-Spain and Alexander Stewart of 21A, Gonzales Circular Road, Port-of-Spain having been appointed Trustees of the Divine Army of the New Creation of Trinidad and Tobago by the said Church Council.

And whereas the said Pastor and the Trustees so appointed have been requested and they have agreed to accept the office as such in Trinidad and Tobago and to hold property for any of the uses or purposes of the said Divine Army of the New Creation in Trinidad and Tobago.

And whereas it is expedient that the Pastor and the Trustees for the time being of the said Divine Army of the New Creation Church should be incorporated and should have powers to hold lands and other property in trust for the said Church.

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows: —

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Divine Army of the New Creation Church Incorporation Act, 1968.

Incorporation of Trustees

2. The Reverend Pastors Garfield Osbourne, Lawrence Superville and Alexander Stewart Trustees and their successors in office as Pastor and Trustees of the Divine Army of the New Creation Church in Trinidad and Tobago shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of Incorporated Trustees of the Divine Army of the New Creation Church in Trinidad and Tobago (hereinafter called "the Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and also by that name may sue and be sued and shall have a common seal with the power to change such seal.

Transfer to, and vesting of lands in Trustees

3. All churches, chapels, mission houses, vicarages, lands and buildings formerly belonging to the Divine Army of the New Creation Church of Trinidad be vested in the Trustees of the said Divine Army of the New Creation and appropriated to the use of the Divine Army of the New Creation Church in Trinidad and Tobago are hereby transferred to and vested in the Trustees of the Divine Army of the New Creation Church of Trinidad and Tobago.

4. Subject to the rules and regulations and control of the Divine Army of the New Creation Church in Trinidad and Tobago the Trustees shall have full power to acquire for the Divine Army of the New Creation Church in Trinidad and Tobago by gift, purchase, demise or otherwise any lands, buildings, messuages and hereditaments of whatever nature or kind so ever in perpetuity or for life or lives or for a term of years and also any moneys, goods and chattels and subject to such rules, regulations and control aforesaid and to the performance of any trusts upon which the said lands, chattels may have been acquired to take hold and enjoy the same.

5. Subject to the rules, regulations and control aforesaid and to the performance of any such trusts as aforesaid and except as hereinafter provided the Trustees may sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, alienate or otherwise dispose of any property by this Act vested in them or which may hereafter be acquired by or become vested in them.

6. All documents requiring the seal of the corporate body shall be sealed by the Secretary for the time being in office with its common seal in the presence of two of the Trustees who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the corporate body.

7. (1) The corporate body shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the corporate body and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the corporate body may be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

(2) Failure to register such address shall render the corporate body liable to a penalty of twenty-five dollars and a further penalty of five dollars for each day that such address remains unregistered.

8. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the Rights of Her Majesty, or of any bodies politic or corporate, or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
