Act No. 33 of 1968

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge and matters incidental thereto

[Assented to 22nd October, 1968]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago a Society known as the "Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge" (hereinafter referred to as "the Society").

Preamble

And whereas it is expedient that the Society should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge (Incorporation) Act, 1968.

2. The Society known as the Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge shall be and is hereby created a body corporate.

3. The Association may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions.

4. (1) Subject to all laws (including this Act) and its rules from time to time in force, the Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge shall have the powers hereinafter set forth in this section and such other powers as are appropriate to its objects as from time to time specified in such rules.

(2) Subject as aforesaid the Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge shall have power:

- (a) To acquire, devise, or otherwise deal with all messuages lands, tenancies and hereditaments of any tenure and also all moneys, securities for money, goods and chattels whatsoever, and may hold and enjoy the same.
- (b) To accept surrenders and reconveyances and to enter into contracts.
- (c) To sell, demise, grant, convey, mortgage, reconvey, surrender, exchange or otherwise dispose of all or any property from time to time vested in it.

5. All deeds, documents, or other instruments requiring the seal of the Society shall be sealed with the common seal of the Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge in the presence of two members of the Executive who shall sign every such deed, document or other instrument to

which the common seal is affixed, and such signing shall be prima facie evidence that the seal was duly and properly affixed and that the seal is the lawful seal of the Society for the Propagation of Eternal Knowledge.

6. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors or any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by, through from or under them.
