TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 32 of 1968

[L.S.]

AN ACT for the incorporation of certain persons as Trustees
of the Hunters' Association of Trinidad and Tobago.

[Assented to 7th November, 1968]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and ^{Preamble} Tobago an Association known as the Hunters' Association of Trinidad and Tobago (hereinafter called "The Association").

And whereas Carl Adolph Meyer of Port-of-Spain, Francis McDonald Brash of San Fernando and William Scholasticus Henry Pyke of Port-of-Spain have been appointed President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer respectively of the Association.

And whereas by a resolution of the Association passed on Saturday the 11th day of March, 1967, it was resolved that the said Carl Adolph Meyer, Francis McDonald Brash and William Scholasticus Henry Pyke and their successors in office be incorporated as Trustees of the Hunters' Association of Trinidad and Tobago with power to hold land and other property in trust for the Association.

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Hunters' Association of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1968.

Incorporation of Trustees

2. The said Carl Adolph Meyer, President, Francis McDonald Brash, Vice-President and William Scholasticus Henry Pyke, Secretary-Treasurer, and their successors in office shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of the Incorporated Trustees of the Hunters' Association of Trinidad and Tobago (hereinafter called "the Incorporated Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in Trinidad and Tobago and shall have and use a common seal with power from time to time to change such seal provided that no such change shall be made except by a resolution of the members at the Annual General Meeting of the Association so incorporated (hereinafter referred to as "the Association").

Power of Trustees to acquire and dispose of property

3. (1) The Incorporated Trustees shall, subject to the Rules, regulations and control of the Association, have full power to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or otherwise, any real or personal property in Trinidad and Tobago or any estate or interest therein.

(2) The Incorporated Trustees shall subject to the Rules, regulations, and control aforesaid and to any restraint, reservations or condition contained in the

document under which they shall have acquired title thereto, be entitled to sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by them.

4. All deeds, documents, or other instruments requiring the seal of "the Association shall be sealed with the common seal of the 'Hunters' Association of Trinidad and Tobago" in the presence of the President and Secretary who shall sign every such deed, document or other instrument to which the common seal is affixed and such signing shall be sufficient evidence that such seal was duly and properly affixed, and that it is the lawful seal of the Association.

Mode of
execution of
documents

5. (1) The Association, shall at all times have a permanent address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Association may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

(2) Failure to register such address shall render the corporate body liable to a penalty of fifty dollars and a further penalty of ten dollars for each day that such address remains unregistered.

6. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
