4. The Surgeon General shall be the consulting surgeon of the colonial hospital and the medical attendant of the police force, in the town of Port of Spain.

5. There shall be paid to the Surgeon-General from the Colonial Treasury, a salary at the rate of five hundred pounds per annum.

AN ORDINANCE to repeal the Ordinance No. 5 of 1869, entitled "An Ordinance for the better regulation of the Colonial Hospital of Port of Spain, and to make other regulation for the government of the said hospital."

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed in Council on the twenty-third day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, entitled "An Ordinance for the better regulation of the Colonial Hospital of Port of Spain"; And whereas it is expedient to repeal the said Ordinance and to make other provision for the regulation of the said Colonial Hospital: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

Repeals
Ordinance
No. 5 of 1869.

1. The said Ordinance of the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

2. The Colonial Hospital of Port of Spain shall consist of two departments, "The Medical Department and the Non-medical Department." Division of departments.

3. The medical department shall consist of a consulting physician, a consulting surgeon, a house surgeon, an assistant surgeon, a dispenser and an assistant dispenser; And the non-medical department shall be under the charge of the colonial store keeper. Staff of hospital.

4. There shall be allowed a matron and such nurses for the patients in the Colonial Hospital, and such clerks for the assistance of the colonial store keeper in the discharge of the duties of such store keeper, and such servants for the care of the buildings and grounds of the hospital, as the Governor may from time to time see fit. Power to Governor to employ nurses, &c.

5. All persons to be appointed, after the passing of this Ordinance, to the office of house surgeon or assistant surgeon shall from time to time be appointed by, and shall hold office during the pleasure of Her Majesty, her heirs and successors; And all persons to be appointed to the other offices under this Ordinance, save and except the office of colonial store keeper shall be appointed from time to time, and may be removed by the Governor. As to the appointment of a house surgeon, assistant surgeon and colonial storekeeper.

6. Neither the house surgeon nor the assistant surgeon shall practise as a private physician or surgeon; and they shall reside at the Colonial Hospital. House surgeon and assistant surgeon not to be allowed private practice, and to reside at hospital.

7. There shall be paid from the Colonial Treasury to the house surgeon a salary at the rate of four hundred and fifty pounds per annum, to the assistant surgeon a salary at the rate of three hundred pounds per annum, and to the dispenser, assistant dispenser, matron, nurses and servants to be appointed under this Ordinance, such salaries or wages as the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council shall from time to time allow. Salaries to be paid.

8. All requisitions for medicines and surgical instruments for the use of the hospital shall be made from time to time, in writing, by the house surgeon, and approved by the surgeon general, and all such medicines and surgical instruments shall be under the charge of the dispenser, and shall be issued from time to time on the order in writing of the house surgeon. As to the mode of obtaining supply of medicines and surgical instruments—their custody and issue.

9. The colonial store keeper shall have the charge of all stores (not being medicines or surgical instruments) and provisions for the use of the hospital, and shall issue such stores and provisions in such quantities as may be from time to time required on the order in writing of the house-surgeon.

Power of
Governor and

10. It shall be lawful for the Governor and Executive Council, to alter the rules made by the Governor and the Legislative Council on the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and from time to time to make other rules and regulations for the good order and government of the Colonial Hospital, the admission of patients, the distribution and performance of the duties of the officers and servants of the same; and such rules and regulations, from time to time, to revoke, alter, or annul.

11. The rules and regulations made by the Governor and Legislative Council on the first day of October, 1860—shall be and the same are hereby revoked.

AN ORDINANCE for the Prevention of Glanders.

WHEREAS on the twenty-third day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, an Ordinance, No. 15, of 1868, was passed in Council, entitled "An Ordinance for the Prevention of Glanders"; and whereas it is expedient to repeal the said Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—
