him for licenses and badges, and of all expenses of inspecting horses and carriages, or otherwise of, or incident to the execution of the Principal Ordinance, including in such expenses any reasonable remuneration paid for clerical assistance, and shall, on the first day of the months of January and July in every year, or within thirty days thereafter transmit to the Town Clerk and Treasurer of the Borough of San Fernando a transcript of such account made up to the last day of the preceding month, and shall hold the balance of such moneys upon trust to pay the same to such Town Clerk and Treasurer, after deducting thereout such expenses as aforesaid: Provided that such Chief Officer of Police shall be entitled to be allowed any sum actually and in good faith paid in respect of the expenses aforesaid, and shall not be responsible for any loss or misapplication unless the same happened through his wilful act or omission.

AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Foreign Reprints Ordinance, 1874."

(L.S.) S. FREELING, *Governor.*

12th December, 1881.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. In the "Foreign Reprints Ordinance, 1874," the words "The Collector of Customs" shall be substituted for the words "The Receiver-General" wherever those words occur.

In the ninth section of the said Ordinance the words

“Paymaster-General” shall be substituted for the words “The Commissioners of Her Majesty’s Customs.”

The said Ordinance shall be read and construed as if the words “Collector of Customs” and “Paymaster-General” had originally been inserted therein instead of the words “Receiver-General” and “The Commissioners of Her Majesty’s Customs” respectively.

AN ORDINANCE to amend “The Education Ordinance, 1875.”

(L.S.) S. FREELING, *Governor.*

12th December, 1881.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as Short title. “The Education Ordinance, 1875, Amendment Ordinance, 1881.”

2. This Ordinance shall be read and construed as one Construction with “The Education Ordinances, 1870 and 1875.”

3. The sixth section of “The Education Ordinance, Repeal. 1875,” is hereby repealed.
