AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Public Health Ordinance, 1869."

(L.S.) S. FREELING, *Governor.*

6th July, 1881.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

The word "owner" means the attorney of a joint stock company where the premises belong to any such company, and also the person in charge as chief authority of the premises of a non-resident proprietor.
Interpretation of rent.

1. In addition to the signification given to it by the "Public Health Ordinance, 1869," the word "owner" in that Ordinance shall, in case "the premises" are the property of a Joint Stock Company, mean the person who for the time being is the attorney or agent of the Company to which such premises belong and also shall, where the person entitled for the time being to receive the rent of the "premises" is not resident in the Island, mean the "person" for the time being in charge of the premises as the chief authority thereon.

2. Wherever it occurs in the Public Health Ordinance, 1869, the word "rent" shall include crops, issues and profits.

Incorporation of this Ordinance with the Public Health Ordinance, 1869.

3. This Ordinance shall be read and construed as one with the "Public Health Ordinance, 1869."
