AN ORDINANCE to amend the Ordinance No. 4 of 1858, intituled "An Ordinance to Facilitate the Investment of Suitors' Moneys."

Certain
debentures,
&c., to be
negotiable.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the provisions of the Ordinance No. 4 of 1858, intituled "An Ordinance to facilitate the Investment of Suitors' Moneys," whereby in certain cases the negotiability of debentures issued by or under the authority of the Government of this Colony may be restricted, should not apply to debentures or coupons issued under the Port of Spain and Arima Railway (Money) Ordinance, 1873: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

Every debenture issued under the said Port of Spain and Arima Railway (Money) Ordinance, 1873, and the coupons thereto, and the right to receive the principal moneys and interest respectively secured or represented

thereby shall, notwithstanding anything contained in the said Ordinance No. 4 of 1858, intituled "An Ordinance to facilitate the Investment of Suitors' Moneys," be transferable by delivery.

AN ORDINANCE to make provision as to the Signature of Negotiable Instruments in certain cases.

(L. S.) HENRY T. IRVING.

1st August, 1879.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Negotiable Instruments Ordinance, 1879." Short title.

2. Where any person, signing in characters which are not European or by a mark, signs a bill of exchange for a sum not exceeding ten pounds as drawer, acceptor or indorser, or signs a promissory note for a sum not exceeding ten pounds as maker or indorser, such signature shall have no effect whatever unless it is made in the presence of and attested by the Protector, Sub-Protector or any Inspector of Immigrants, a Commissioner of a Province, Justice of the Peace, Clerk of the Peace,

Signature of bills of exchange and notes in characters not European.
