

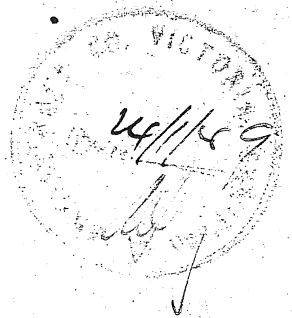

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Electric Installations
(Buildings) Ordinance, 1945, No. 17 of 1945.

[22nd January, 1949.]

E NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Electric Installations (Buildings) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Electric Installations (Buildings) Ordinance, 1945, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance. Short title.

Section 5 (2) of Principal Ordinance amended.

2. Subsection (2) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following subsection:—

“(2) Every such licence to act as a wireman shall be in the prescribed form and shall have attached thereto one of two recent photographs of the holder thereof which shall be supplied to the Licensing Authority by the applicant for a licence when making his application ; and every such licence shall be valid for a period of five years from the date on which it is granted unless sooner cancelled as hereinafter provided.”

Schedule to Principal Ordinance amended.

3. (1) Paragraph 3 of Form I of Schedule A to the Electric Installations (Wiremen’s Licences and Fees) Rules 1945 (which are contained in the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance) is hereby amended by adding the words “my photograph in duplicate and” immediately after the word “hereto”.

(2) Form 3 of the said Schedule A is hereby amended by substituting the expression “from19..... to19..... inclusive” for the expression “during the year 19.....”

(3) Schedule B to the said Rules is hereby amended by substituting for the figures “24” and “12” the figures “120” and “60” respectively.

(4) The amendments to the said Rules effected by the preceding subsections of this section shall be deemed to have been made and confirmed in accordance with section 11 of the Principal Ordinance.
