AN ORDINANCE to repeal certain duties of Customs,  
and to raise other duties in lieu thereof.

(L.S.) HENRY T. IRVING.  
*18th November, 1879.*

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance shall be cited for all purposes as Short title.  
"The Customs Duties Ordinance, 1879."

Commence-  
ment.

2. This Ordinance shall not come into operation until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, which day is in this Ordinance referred to as the commencement of this Ordinance.

Articles liable  
to duty.

3. From and after the commencement of this Ordinance there shall be raised, levied, collected and paid unto Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, for the use of the Colony upon all goods, wares and merchandise already imported into this Colony whereof the duties have not been already collected or paid, and upon all goods, wares and merchandise thereafter to be imported into this Colony the several duties and rates as the same are respectively set forth in figures in the table hereinafter contained, that is to say :—

Moneys and weights and measures.

5. All sums of money payable under this Ordinance shall be deemed and are hereby declared to be sterling money of Great Britain, and all duties under this Ordinance shall be paid and received according to the imperial weights and measures by law established; and in all cases where such duties are imposed according to any specific quantity or value the same shall be deemed to apply in the same proportion to any greater or less quantity or value.

Repeal of Ordinances.

6. From and after the commencement of this Ordinance, The Customs Duties Ordinance, 1878, and section 92 of The Customs Ordinance, 1878, shall be repealed: Provided that this repeal shall not affect any right accrued or money accrued due to Her Majesty before such commencement or any penalty, forfeiture or liability incurred or capable of being imposed in respect of any act done or omitted before such commencement or any remedy or proceedings in respect of any of the matters aforesaid.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with  
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council,  
as follows :—

*Preliminary.*

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as Short title.

3. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to  
time, by order published in the *Royal Gazette*, to declare  
any public road to be a main road. All roads not so
