AN ORDINANCE for extending the time for the Re-payment by the Borough Council of Port of Spain of Moneys advanced from the Colonial Treasury under the "Public Health Ordinance, 1869."

WHEREAS during the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, divers sums of money, amounting in the whole to the sum of two thousand four hundred and ninety-eight pounds twelve shillings and sixpence, were advanced to the Superintendent of Public Works from the Colonial Treasury of this Island, under the provisions of the "Public Health Ordinance, 1869," No. 16, for expenses incurred in the performance of certain work within the borough of Port-of-Spain, and by virtue of such Ordinance the said sum of two thousand four hundred and ninety-eight pounds twelve

shillings and sixpence became a debt due to Her Majesty, to be paid from the funds of the said borough: And whereas the General Board of Health under the authority of the said Ordinance did, on the eleventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, make an order on the town clerk and treasurer of the said borough to levy a rate for the purpose of re-paying the said sum of two thousand four hundred and ninety-eight pounds twelve shillings and sixpence, but the time fixed by the said Ordinance for assessing and levying such rate has been allowed to lapse: And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made to authorise the assessing and levying of the moneys necessary to repay the said sum of two thousand four hundred and ninety-eight pounds twelve shillings and sixpence, and to extend the time for the payment of the said moneys as hereinafter mentioned: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:

1. The Town Clerk and Treasurer of the Borough of Port of Spain shall, within fifteen days next after the commencement of this Ordinance, assess on all houses and lands subject to be rated under the Ordinance No. 10 of 1853, entitled "An Ordinance for the Regulation of Municipal Corporations in this Island," according to the value at which the same were assessed in the year 1870 under the said Ordinance, such a rate as shall be sufficient to raise and pay off the said sum of two thousand four hundred and ninety-eight pounds twelve shillings and sixpence, together with the reasonable costs of assessing and levying the same, and notice of such rate shall be published by the town clerk and treasurer in the *Royal Gazette*.

2. The rate so assessed and levied shall be paid to the said town clerk and treasurer in manner following, that is to say: One moiety thereof, or so near thereto as may be practicable, on or before the first day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and the residue thereof on or before the first day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two: And in case of non-payment the same shall be recoverable, together with a percentage of ten pounds for every

one hundred pounds, in the same manner as is provided by the said Ordinance No. 10 of 1853 with regard to rates under the said Ordinance.

3. From and out of the moneys so raised there shall be repaid to the Receiver General the sum of two thousand four hundred and ninety-eight pounds, twelve shillings and sixpence, and the surplus if any shall be applied to the purpose of carrying out the "Public Health Ordinance, 1869."

Passed in Council this nineteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

WHEREAS a certain company called the Inter-^{Preamble.}
national Ocean Telegraph Company, lately applied to the Governor for permission to establish telegraphic communication between this island and Europe by way of the Island of Cuba and the United States of America: And whereas at a meeting of the Legislative Council, held on the first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the said application was approved, and the said Council recommended the granting of a subsidy to the said Company during a limited term of years subject to certain terms and conditions in consideration of their
