AN ORDINANCE to amend the provisions of the Immigration Ordinances, 1896 and 1897, with respect to the rights of future Immigrants to return passages.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Immigrants Return Passage Ordinance, 1898."

2. Every immigrant arriving in the Colony after the commencement of this Ordinance shall on the conditions and subject to the provisions in other respects contained in Section 227 of "The Immigration Ordinance, 1896," be entitled to be provided with a passage back to the port whence he sailed for this Colony, on payment by him of one-half instead of one-fourth of the passage money in the

case of males and of one-third instead one-sixth there
in the case of females the cost of out-fit for the voyage
being paid by such returning immigrant. And as to
immigrants the provisions of the said Section shall
deemed to be amended accordingly.

Passed in Council this Eighteenth day of July
in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
ninety-eight.
