AN ORDINANCE to amend the Law relating to
Quarantine.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and
Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ The Quarantine Short title.
Amendment Ordinance, 1898.” Construction.

It shall be read as one with “ The Quarantine
Ordinances, 1893-1896.”

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of “ The Quarantine Disinfection
of passengers’
clothing.
Ordinances, 1893-1896,” the Health Officer may
require that the clothing of passengers and crew on any
ship entering any harbour in the Colony on which any
infectious disease has occurred during the voyage or
which has arrived from any infected port after the

expiration of the incubation period shall be disinfected with as little delay as possible; and in the event of the Health Officer so requiring, no such passengers or crew shall be allowed to communicate with the shore until after such disinfection has been carried out.

Passed in Council this Eighteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
