**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. The Inspector-General of Police shall from time to time make, alter or annul rules to be observed by persons riding bicycles or tricycles on any street or highway of this Colony, and by drivers of other vehicles and other persons using the highway in respect of the safety of persons using bicycles or tricycles, and such rules, after being approved by the Governor and published in the *Royal Gazette* shall have the force of law.

2. Such rules may prescribe penalties not exceeding £5 on conviction before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction of any breach of the same which penalties may be enforced by any person in a summary manner before any Stipendiary Justice of the Peace.
