AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Foreign Labour Contract Ordinance, 1894."

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Foreign Labour Contract Ordinance, 1898." It shall be read as one with "The Foreign Labour Contract Ordinance, 1894," hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. The Principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may together be cited as "The Foreign Labour Contract Ordinances, 1894 and 1898." Short title, etc. (3-1894.)

2. Wherever in the Principal Ordinance the word "Company" occurs the same shall be read as if in lieu thereof the word "Employer" were used. "Employer" in lieu of "Company."

Penalty on

3. Any person proposing or endeavouring to employ, hire, engage or induce any person to leave the Colony or to send or take away any person therefrom for the purpose of being employed by any employer as a labourer in any foreign country (within the meaning of the Principal Ordinance) shall be deemed an Employer within the meaning hereof and shall commit an offence against and be liable to the penalties provided in the said Ordinance, in the same manner as thereby provided in the case of a Company within the meaning of the said Ordinance.
