AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1893—(18 of 1893)."

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as Short title.  
"The Quarantine Ordinance, 1896."

It shall be read and construed as one with "The Quarantine Ordinances, 1893-94," and with "The Quarantine (Amendment) Ordinance, 1895," which together with this Ordinance may be cited as "The Quarantine Ordinances, 1893-96."

Repeal.

2. Section 50 of "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1893," is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

Certificate of  
non-communi-  
cation at  
Foreign Port.

A certificate of non-communication produced by a vessel arriving from any foreign port or place shall not be accepted as such unless given by the Port Authority, and verified by the British Consular Authority, or the Chief Executive Officer where there is no such Consular Authority, and unless there is contained in such certificate a statement of the actual procedure adopted.

Saving.

3. The repeal by this Ordinance shall not affect the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered, or any right accrued or liability incurred before the commencement of this Ordinance, or any proceeding pending or uncompleted at the commencement of this Ordinance.

Passed in Council this Twenty-sixth day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.
