AN ORDINANCE to amend the Port-of-Spain Water Works Ordinances, 1851 to 1883, and the Port-of-Spain Water Works (Amendment) Ordinance, 1885.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Port-of-Spain Short title. Water Works Ordinance, 1896.”

“The Port-of-Spain Water Works Ordinances, 1851 to 1883” and “The Port-of-Spain Water Works (Amendment) Ordinance, 1885” (No. 23—1885) together may be cited as “The Port-of-Spain Water Works Ordinances, 1851 to 1885.”

This Ordinance shall be read as one with “The Port-of-Spain Water Works Ordinances, 1851 to 1885.”

“The Port-of-Spain Water Works Ordinances, 1851 to 1885” and this Ordinance may together be cited as “The Port-of-Spain Water Works Ordinances, 1851 to 1896.”

Peru Village
boundaries.

2. Section 5 of “The Port-of-Spain Water Works Ordinance, 1883” is hereby amended by the addition of the following Sub-section:—

(3.) Peru Village, being the area comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say:

North—Belle Vue lands and part of Woodbrook lands, South—the sea and part of Woodbrook lands, East—St. James’s Barracks lands and part of the Maraval river, West—part of the lands of Woodbrook and the lands of M. Philip.

3. Section 6 of “The Port-of-Spain Water Works (Amendment) Ordinance, 1885” (No. 23—1885) is hereby amended by the addition of the words “or Peru Village” after the words “in Belmont” wherever the same occur in the said section.
