AN ORDINANCE to authorize the Governor to take  
leave of absence in certain cases.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative  
Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may for all purposes be cited as Short title.  
“The Governor’s leave of absence Ordinance, 1895.”

2. Subject in each case to the permission of Her  
Majesty’s Secretary of State for the Colonies first had  
and obtained it shall be lawful for the Governor to take  
leave of absence on full pay for the purpose of visiting  
in the public interest other British West Indian Colonies  
for such term as may be fixed by the Secretary of State.

3. The leave of absence by this Ordinance authorized shall be in addition to the leave privileges which the Governor already enjoys.
