AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Pilots Ordinance,  
1893."

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may for all purposes be cited as Short title.  
"The Pilots Ordinance, 1895."

2. This Ordinance shall be read and construed with Construction.  
"The Pilots Ordinance, 1893." "The Pilots Ordinance, 1893," hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance, and this Ordinance may together be cited for all purposes as "The Pilots Ordinances, 1893-95."

3. Section 23 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Repeal.  
repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:

23. If any damage shall be caused by any ship while in charge of a Pilot to any beacon buoy, harbour mark, jetty, or other public property, it shall be lawful for the Harbour Master of Trinidad and of Tobago respectively or any person by him authorised in that behalf to sue for and recover such damage in the Supreme Court exercising Admiralty jurisdiction as a Colonial Court of Admiralty under the provisions of the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890. 4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Section 24 of the Principal Ordinance, if any Pilot commits any of the offences in such Section mentioned he shall on conviction before any Stipendiary Justice of the Peace in addition to any liability for damages at the suit of the person aggrieved or damnified forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds, and in default of payment shall be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding three months; and he shall be furthermore liable to have his license cancelled or be suspended by the Commissioners.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 27 of the Principal Ordinance, every licensed Pilot who commits any offence in such Section mentioned shall on conviction thereof before any Stipendiary Justice of the Peace forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten Pounds sterling, and in default of payment shall be imprisoned for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour.

6. "The Pilots Ordinance, 1894," (29-1894) is hereby <sup>Repeal.</sup> repealed.

Provided that the repeals by this Ordinance shall not affect any right accrued, or any offence committed or any liability, penalty or forfeiture incurred before the commencement of this Ordinance, or any remedy or proceeding in respect of such right, offence, liability, penalty, or forfeiture.
