AN ORDINANCE to authorize the erection of Fountains or Dippers in certain districts of the Island.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may for all purposes be cited as “The Water Supply Ordinance, 1895.”

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any Ordinance heretofore made or passed, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit, by Proclamation to authorize the erection of Fountains or Dippers in such districts or localities as may be defined in such Proclamation, and to impose rates on premises

within such districts, and the Director of Public Works, on such order being made, shall cause such Fountains or Dippers to be erected.

Rates.

3. On all premises within the limits of any district proclaimed as aforesaid there shall be levied and paid such rates as shall be prescribed by such Proclamation.

Rates to be a  
land charge.

4. All rates levied under this Ordinance shall be deemed to be Public Land Charges within the meaning of and shall be subject to the provisions of the Land Charges and Land Taxes Ordinance, 1893.

Passed in Council this Nineteenth day of August, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.
