AN ORDINANCE to enable the Registrar-General to execute the duties of an Examiner of Titles.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Real Property Ordinance, 1889," the Governor is empowered to appoint one or more persons being Barristers or Conveyancers to be Examiners of Titles to advise and assist in carrying out the provisions of the said Ordinance; And whereas it is expedient that the Registrar-General shall execute the duties of Examiner of Titles as defined by "The Real Property Ordinance, 1889:" Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as Short title.

Construction. 2. This Ordinance shall be construed as one with "The Real Property Ordinance, 1889," and the Ordinance No. 16 of 1890, intituled "An Ordinance to amend 'The Real Property Ordinance, 1889.'" This Ordinance and the two last mentioned Ordinances may be cited together as "The Real Property Ordinances, 1889, 1890, and 1893."

Duties of Examiner of Titles to be executed by the Registrar-General. 3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Real Property Ordinance, 1889," all the duties attached to the office of Examiner of Titles under and by virtue of the said Ordinance shall henceforth be executed by the Registrar-General to the same extent and in the same manner as if he had been appointed an Examiner of Titles under and by virtue of the said Ordinance: Provided nevertheless that nothing herein contained shall enable any Deputy Registrar-General to execute the duties of Examiner of Titles.

Registrar-General to be a Barrister or Conveyancer. 4. Every future Registrar-General shall be a Barrister-at-Law or a Conveyancer.

Passed in Council this Sixth day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.
