AN ORDINANCE to commute for a fixed sum certain charges heretofore payable by the Mayor and Burgesses of the Borough of Arima in respect of Education, Vaccination, Public Hospitals, Relief of the Poor, and Fees for Registration of Births and Deaths.

Whereas there is now due and owing from the Mayor and Burgesses of Arima to the Public Revenue of the Island of Trinidad in respect of the expenses of poor persons admitted into Public Hospitals from the 1st day of January, 1892, to the 30th day of June, 1892, the sum of £36 6s.: Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. There shall be paid to the Receiver-General on behalf of the Government of the Colony by the Mayor and Burgesses of the Borough of Arima by equal annual payments, commencing from the 1st day of July, 1892, and payable on the 30th day of June of the next and every succeeding year, the sum of £125, and upon payment to the Receiver-General of the said sum of £36 6s.

Recital of debt due from Borough of Arima to Public Revenue.

On payment to Government of annual sum of £125, Borough of Arima to be relieved from obligation in respect of Education, Public Hospitals, Relief of the Poor, Vaccination, and Registration of Births and Deaths.

so due as aforesaid, and in consideration of such annual payments as aforesaid, the Mayor and Burgesses of such Borough shall be relieved as from the first day of July, 1892, from the following obligations :—

- (a.) Any obligation imposed upon the said Mayor and Burgesses by the 61st Section of Ordinance No. 10 of 1853, intituled "An Ordinance for the regulation of Municipal Corporations in this Island" (hereinafter called "The Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1853,") or by virtue of any Rule or other Law or Ordinance to maintain primary and infant schools within the limits of the said Borough, anything in the 93rd Section of the said "The Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1853," contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.
- (b.) Any obligation upon the said Mayor and Burgesses arising by virtue of "The Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1853," or by virtue of any Rule or other Law or Ordinance to pay money out of the funds and moneys of the said Borough of Arima in respect of poor persons admitted into any Public Hospital.
- (c.) Any obligation upon the said Mayor and Burgesses, expressed or implied, arising by virtue of the 58th Section of "The Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1853," or otherwise, or by virtue of any Rule or other Law or Ordinance to allow from the Borough

funds of the said Borough such reasonable sum as the Council of the said Borough might from time to time see fit for the maintenance and support of indigent persons.

(d.) The obligation imposed by the 17th Section of the Ordinance No. 23 of 1872, intituled "An Ordinance to improve and consolidate the law with regard to the practice of Vaccination" upon the Town Clerk of the said Borough of Arima or by virtue of any Rule or other Law or Ordinance to pay from the funds of such Borough the amounts made payable by the said Section of the said Ordinance or by any such other Rule, Law or Ordinance to the District Vaccinator in respect of primary vaccination and re-vaccination successfully performed within the said Borough, and which said amounts shall hereafter be payable to such District Vaccinator from the General Revenue of the Island of Trinidad.

(e.) The obligation imposed by the 23rd Section of the Ordinance No. 13 of 1847, intituled "An Ordinance for registering Births, Deaths and Marriages," or by virtue of any Rule or other Law or Ordinance, upon the Town Clerk and Treasurer of the Borough of Arima to pay to the Registrar-General from and out of the money in his hand or power as such Town Clerk or Treasurer the

amounts by the said Section of the said Ordinance or by such other Rule, Law or Ordinance made payable to the Registrar-General in respect of the Registration of Births and Deaths.
