AN ORDINANCE to amend the Medical Service Ordinance,
No. 195.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Medical Service Short Title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1913.

2. A Supernumerary Medical Officer shall be entitled to an increment of £50 after each period of five years service reckoned from the date of his first appointment on probation, and in the event of his becoming a Government Medical Officer his service shall for the purpose of ascertaining the number of incremental rises to which he is entitled under Section 9 of the Medical Service Ordinance, No. 195, be reckoned from the date of his first appointment on probation as aforesaid. Incremental rise for Supernumerary Medical Officers.

Passed in Council this Nineteenth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.
