AN ORDINANCE to amend the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1912.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Solicitors' Short Title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1914.

2. Sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1912, is amended by inserting after the word "honours" in line 16 the words "or having received a certificate from the local Secretary of the Oxford or of the Cambridge Local Examinations that he has obtained marks which but for his age would have entitled him to be placed in the first class in honours."

3. The amendment made in the preceding section shall have retrospective effect, and Sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1912, shall be read as if the
