AN ORDINANCE to make provision for the protection of certain Wild Birds and Wild Animals.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Wild Birds and Short Title. Wild Animals (Protection) Ordinance, 1915.

2. In this Ordinance—

“Wild Bird” includes any bird specified in the first or second Schedule to this Ordinance, or in any proclamation of the Governor under Section 12 of this Ordinance.

“Wild Animal” includes any animal specified in the third or fourth Schedule to this Ordinance, or in any proclamation of the Governor under Section 12 of this Ordinance.

“Constable” means a member of the Constabulary Force;

"Gun" includes air gun, blow pipe and any instrument whereby a missile may be propelled.

Protection of

3. Any person who

- (a.) Knowingly kills, wounds or takes any wild bird specified in the First Schedule hereto or any wild animal specified in the Third Schedule hereto; or
- (b.) Knowingly has in his possession any such wild bird or animal killed, wounded or taken, or any part of such bird or animal; or
- (c.) Takes or has in his possession the nest or egg of any wild bird;

is guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such wild bird or wild animal or any part thereof and for every such nest or egg in respect of which an offence is committed.

Onus of proof.

4. Where any person has in his possession the whole or part of any wild bird specified in the first Schedule to this Ordinance or the nest or egg of any wild bird or the whole or part of any wild animal specified in the Third Schedule, the proof that such bird or animal was killed, wounded or taken or that such nest or egg was taken before the commencement of this Ordinance, or out of the Colony, shall be upon such person.

Close season.

5.—(1.) Any person who between the thirty-first day of March and the first day of October in any year, knowingly kills, wounds or takes any wild bird specified in the second Schedule to this Ordinance, is guilty of an offence.

(2.) Any person who between the thirty-first day of March and the first day of October in any year, exposes or offers for sale, or purchases any wild bird specified in the second Schedule to this Ordinance is guilty of an offence.

(3.) Any person who between the thirty-first day of December and the first day of July in any year, knowingly kills, wounds or takes any wild animal specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Ordinance, or exposes or offers for sale or purchases any such wild animal or any part thereof is guilty of an offence.

(4.) Any person convicted of an offence under this section is for each bird or animal or for each part of any animal in respect of which the offence is committed, liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

6. The Governor may with regard to any particular species of, or with regard to all of the wild birds mentioned in the second Schedule to this Ordinance, and with regard to any wild animal mentioned in the fourth Schedule to this Ordinance and with respect to the whole of or to any particular part of the Colony, by proclamation extend or vary the time during which the killing, wounding, taking, exposing, offering for sale and purchasing of the same or any of them are prohibited by this Ordinance. After such proclamation, the penalties imposed by this Ordinance in respect of such wild birds and wild animals shall apply only to offences committed during the time specified in such proclamation. Close season may be varied.

7. The Governor by writing under his hand, may, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Ordinance, for such time and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, authorise any person, for scientific purposes, to kill, wound or take any wild bird or any wild animal, or to take the nest or eggs of any wild bird. Scientific purposes.

8.—(1.) It shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation to prohibit to be exported or carried coastwise : Governor may prohibit exportation of birds, nests eggs and animals.

(a.) Any bird or any part thereof ; or

(b.) Any animal or any part thereof ; or

(c.) The nests or eggs of any bird :

to be specified in such proclamation.

(2.) If anything mentioned in any proclamation issued under the preceding Sub-section is exported or brought to any quay or other place to be shipped for exportation or to be carried coastwise or is water-borne to be so exported or carried, such thing shall be forfeited and

the exporter or his agent or the shipper of any such thing is liable to a penalty of £100 in addition to any other penalty to which he may be liable under this Ordinance.

Governor  
may prohibit

9. It shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation to declare dead birds and any part of a dead bird and the nests and eggs of any birds and dead animals and any part of a dead animal to be goods prohibited to be imported, and thereupon the like penalties shall follow and the like consequences shall ensue in all respects as if any such thing as above specified had been enumerated or described among goods so prohibited to be imported in the table of Prohibitions and Restrictions contained in Section 11 of the Customs Ordinance (No. 178).

Customs Ordinance to apply to birds, animals, etc.

10. All the provisions of the Customs Ordinance (No. 178) relating to uncustomed and prohibited goods and proceedings for breaches of the law relating thereto, shall apply as fully and effectually to birds or parts of birds or the nests and eggs of any bird, or animals or any parts thereof prohibited to be exported, carried coastwise or imported under this Ordinance as aforesaid, as if such things as above specified had been prohibited to be exported, carried coastwise, or imported under and by virtue of the said Customs Ordinance.

Exportation of wild birds, &c., killed for scientific purposes.

11. It shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall so think fit, by writing under his hand to exempt from the operation of any proclamation made by him in pursuance of Section 8 of this Ordinance any birds or animals killed, wounded or taken, and any nests or eggs taken for scientific purposes by any person duly licensed by writing under the hand of the Governor in pursuance of the provisions of Section 7 of this Ordinance.

Governor may amend schedules.

12.—(1.) It shall be lawful for the Governor whenever he may deem fit from time to time by proclamation to amend any Schedule to this Ordinance by adding thereto or excluding therefrom any wild bird or wild animal.

(2.) Immediately upon the publication of any such proclamation the provisions of this Ordinance shall from thenceforth apply to any wild bird or wild animal therein specified.

13.—(1.) All proclamations made under the provisions of Sections 6, 8, 9 and 12 of this Ordinance shall be published in the *Royal Gazette*. Publication of Proclamations.

(2.) A copy of the *Royal Gazette* containing any proclamation purporting to have been made under this Ordinance shall be evidence of the due making and tenor thereof.

14. Where any person is found offending against this Ordinance it shall be lawful for any other person to require the offender to give his name, description, and place of abode, and in case the offender does not truly give his name, description and place of abode, such offender is guilty of an offence and is in addition to any other penalty to which he is liable under this Ordinance, liable to a penalty not exceeding £5. Persons found offending.

15. Any constable may arrest without warrant any person found offending against this Ordinance whose name or place of abode is unknown to him and detain such person at a Constabulary station until the name and place of abode of such person can be ascertained, or may forthwith convey such person before a Magistrate to be dealt with according to law. Arrest without warrant.

16. It shall be lawful for any constable, Warden or Ward Officer, in any highway, street or public place to search any person whom he may have good cause to suspect of coming from any land where he shall have been unlawfully in search or pursuit of wild birds or wild animals or of the nests or eggs of wild birds, or any person aiding or abetting such person, and having in his possession any wild bird or wild animal, or the nest or egg of any wild bird, or any gun, part of gun, or nets or engines used for the killing or taking such birds or animals, and also to stop and search any cart or other conveyance in or upon which such constable, Warden or Ward Officer shall have good reason to suspect that any wild bird or wild animal, or the nest or egg of any wild bird or any such article or thing is being carried by any such person, and should there be found any wild bird or wild Power to stop, search, seize and detain offenders.

animal, or any such nest or egg of any wild bird or any such article or thing as aforesaid upon such person, cart or other conveyance, to seize and detain such wild bird, nest, egg, or wild animal, article or thing; and such constable, Warden or Ward officer shall in such case apply to some Justice for a summons citing such person to appear before a Magistrate to be dealt with according to law.

**Procedure.** 17.—(1.) Every offence against this Ordinance shall be punishable on summary conviction before a Magistrate in the manner provided in the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, No. 1.

(2.) Any offence against this Ordinance committed on the sea-coast, or at sea, beyond the limits of any town, county or district, may be inquired of, heard and determined in any town, county or district, abutting on such sea-coast or adjoining such sea.

(3.) Any offence against this Ordinance committed in or upon any water forming the boundary between any two counties or districts may be inquired of, heard and determined in either of such counties or districts.

**Forfeiture.** 18. Any wild bird or wild animal or any part of such wild bird or wild animal and any nest or egg and all such guns, parts of guns, nets and engines, in respect of which a conviction takes place, shall be forfeited to His Majesty.

**Repeal.** 19. The Wild Birds Ordinance No. 132, the Wild Birds Protection Ordinance, No. 307, and the Wild Birds Protection (Amending) Regulation, 1895, relating to Tobago are hereby repealed.

**Commence-  
ment.** 20. This Ordinance shall commence and come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation in the *Royal Gazette*.
