AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Duties Ordinance 1909 (No. 18-1909).

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties Ordinance 1910.

Definition of  
"proof spirit."

2. In this Ordinance and in the Customs Duties Ordinance 1909, the term "proof spirit" means such spirit as at a temperature of 51° Fahrenheit (fifty-one degrees) shall weigh twelve-thirteenths of the weight of an equal bulk of distilled water at the same temperature, and the proof strength shall be that indicated by Sykes' Hydrometer.

3. The First Schedule to the Customs Duties Ordinance 1909 (No. 18-1909) is hereby amended as follows:— Alteration of duties.

(1.) Under the heading of "Meats" shall be read: Meats.

Smoked, including hams and bacon, 4/2 the  
100 lbs.

(2.) The duty on Naptha or Methyl Alcohol, purified Spirits.  
so as to be potable and on Unenumerated spirits  
shall be 15/- the proof gallon.

(3.) Under the heading "Timber" shall be read: Timber.

Staves and Headings of Oak, 10d. the pack  
or packs containing staves and headings  
for one puncheon or two hogsheads.

4. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced Commence-  
ment.  
on the thirtieth day of March, 1910.
