AN ORDINANCE to amend the Sale of Produce Ordinance 1909 (8—1909).

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sale of Produce Ordinance 1910. It shall be read as one with the Sale of Produce Ordinance 1909, hereinafter called the principal Ordinance. Short title.

2. In Sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the principal Ordinance the definition of "licensable produce" shall be read with the omission of the word "coconuts"; and the definition of "produce" shall be read with the addition of the word "coconuts" after the words "sugar cane." Coconuts not licensable produce.

3. Section 19 of the principal Ordinance shall be read with the omission of the following words :— Idem.

"(c.) The uncured or undried almond or kernel of coconuts."

Coconuts. 4. Sections 20 and 26 of the principal Ordinance shall not apply to coconuts.

Idem. 5. Section 21 of the principal Ordinance shall be read with the omission of the words "or of coconuts," and Section 31 shall be read with the omission of the word "coconuts" wherever the same occurs.

Entries in Receipt and Delivery Book. 6. In Section 26 of the principal Ordinance after the words "delivery of any produce" shall be read the words "whether his property or not."

Passed in Council this Sixth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten.
