AN ORDINANCE to amend the Jury Ordinance, No. 33.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Jury Ordinance 1910.

Jurors may separate with leave of the Court.

2. The following proviso shall be read at the end and as part of Section 20 of the Jury Ordinance No. 33:

Provided nevertheless that upon the trial of any person for any offence other than murder, treason or misprision of treason, the Court may, if it think fit, at any time before the jury consider their verdict, permit the jury to separate and go at large.
