AN ORDINANCE to amend the Sunday Closing Ordinance 1909.—(7-1909.)

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sunday Closing Ordinance, 1910. It shall be read as one with the Sunday Closing Ordinance, 1909. Short title.

2. Section 3 of the Sunday Closing Ordinance 1909 is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:— Repeal.

3. Nothing in the last preceding Section shall extend to:—

(a.) The sale or delivery of bread, fresh meat, fresh fish, fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, or ice until nine o'clock in the morning; or Exemption from closing in certain cases.

(b.) The sale or delivery at any hour of fresh milk; or

- (c.) The sale or delivery at any hour of any article required for the burial of a dead body, or for any sick person or animal, where the seller thereof has reasonable ground for believing such article to be required for either of these purposes; or
 - (d.) The sale or delivery of any newspaper published in the Colony on Sunday; or
 - (e.) The sale or delivery of any provisions, stores, coals or other supplies for the use of any vessel anchored in the harbour of Port-of-Spain on the written order of the captain or chief officer and the local agent thereof; or
 - (f.) Any shop in which cooked food alone is sold; or
 - (g.) Any hotel or other licensed premises in relation to a *bonâ fide* guest or traveller as defined by the Liquor Licenses Ordinance No. 177.

Passed in Council this nineteenth day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten.
