AN ORDINANCE relating to the Couva Waterworks.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Couva Water ^{Short title.} Supply Ordinance, 1911.

2. The Provisional Order relating to the Couva Water- ^{Repeal.} works approved by the Legislative Council on the 17th day of April 1905, is hereby revoked.

3. The Waterworks mentioned in the Provisional Order ^{Ordinance 223 not to apply.} revoked by Section 2 hereof shall not be deemed to be Waterworks within the meaning of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 223.

4. It shall be lawful for the Warden of Couva for the ^{Sale of water.} time being, or for any other person appointed by the

Governor for the purpose to sell water from the aforesaid works to the public at such rate as may from time to time be fixed by the Governor.

Passed in Council this twenty-third day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
