AN ORDINANCE to amend the Railways Ordinance,
No. 145.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Railways (Amendment) Ordinance, 1911, and shall be read as one with the Railways Ordinance, No. 145 and the Railways (Amendment) Ordinance, 1905 (No. 19-1905.)

Bye-laws may limit liability of Railway.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Railways Ordinance, No. 145, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council by bye-law to be made in the manner provided in such Ordinance, to limit the liability of the Railway in and about the receiving, forwarding or delivery of animals, articles, goods or things in such manner and to such extent as to the Governor in Executive Council may seem just and reasonable.
