AN ORDINANCE to amend the Mines Regulation Ordinance, 1907 (No. 13):

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Mines Regulation (Amendment) Ordinance, 1912, and shall be read as one with the Mines Regulation Ordinance, 1907, and the Mines Regulation (Amendment) Ordinance, 1909.

Penalty for use of explosives contrary to regulations.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Ordinances in the preceding Section mentioned, the Governor in Executive Council may attach a penalty not exceeding Five Hundred Pounds to the breach of any regulations made under such Ordinances laying down the conditions and limitations under which explosives intended to be used for torpedoing shooting or blasting any well dug or boring drilled for the purpose of obtaining oil may be transported and stored and the manner in which such torpedoing shooting or blasting may be carried out.
