An Ordinance to provide for a loan to the Borough of San Fernando for the purpose of erecting a market.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the San Fernando Market Loan Ordinance, 1912.

Loan to Mayor and Burgesses.

2. The Receiver-General may, on the authority of the Governor, from moneys in his hands, advance to the Mayor and Burgesses of San Fernando the sum of £1,000 for the purposes of erecting and equipping a market at Prince Alfred Street North, in the Town of San Fernando.

Repayment of loan.

3. Such sum of £1,000 shall be a charge upon the general revenue of the Borough of San Fernando, and shall be repayable to the Receiver-General by thirty-three annual instalments of £55 2 1 each by the Mayor and Burgesses of the said Borough out of the said general revenue.

4. Such annual instalments shall be paid on or before the 30th day of June in each year, and the first of such instalments shall be paid on or before the 30th day of June, 1913. ^{Payment of instalments.}
