AN ORDINANCE to amend the Commercial Telephone Company (Limited) Ordinance, No. 247.

WHEREAS in the Schedule to Ordinance No. 247 the charge for a telephone installed in an office or other place of business in the Town of Port-of-Spain has by a clerical error been incorrectly fixed at sixteen shillings per month instead of at sixteen shillings and eight pence per month, the correct charge;

And whereas the Commercial Telephone Company Limited have since the 20th day of October 1903, charged and received the sum of sixteen shillings and eight pence per month in respect of each telephone installed as aforesaid;

And whereas it is desirable to correct the said error, and to indemnify the said Company for having made and received the charge of sixteen shillings and eight pence aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Commercial Telephone Company (Amending) Ordinance, 1906. The Ordinance No. 247 and this Ordinance may together be cited as the Commercial Telephone Company Ordinances, 1905-6.

Charge

2. Notwithstanding the charges specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance No. 247, it is hereby declared that the charge per month for each telephone installed by the said Company in an office or other place of business within the Town of Port-of-Spain is, and since the 20th day of October 1903 always has been the sum of sixteen shillings and eight pence ; and it is hereby further declared that all sums charged and received by the said Company in accordance with that rate since the said 20th day of October 1903, on account of telephones installed in such offices and places as aforesaid have been legally and properly charged and received.
