AN ORDINANCE to amend the law relating to Government Savings Banks.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Savings Banks Ordinance 1906. It shall be read as one with the Savings Banks Ordinance (No. 146) and the Savings Banks Ordinance 1905 (No. 12-1905). The two last mentioned Ordinances and this Ordinance may together be cited as the Savings Banks Ordinances 1905-6.

2.—(1.) The Chief Manager of the Savings Bank may enter into an arrangement with the Postmaster-General in England for the transfer of sums standing to the credit of depositors from a Post Office Savings Bank in the United Kingdom to the Government Savings Bank in this Colony, or from a Government Savings Bank in this Colony to a Post Office Savings Bank in the United Kingdom.

(2.) Whenever such an arrangement has been made, the said Chief Manager may place any amount transferred in pursuance thereof, to the Government Savings Bank in this Colony, to the credit of a depositor's account in that Bank.

(3.) Regulations made by the Governor under Section 33 of the Savings Banks Ordinance (No. 146) may provide for any matters necessary to give effect to transfers authorized in pursuance of this section.
