AN ORDINANCE to amend the Summary Convictions (Offences) Ordinance, No. 5.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Convictions (Offences) Ordinance 1907. It shall be read as one with the Summary Convictions (Offences) Ordinance, No. 5. The latter Ordinance and this Ordinance may together be cited as the Summary Convictions (Offences) Ordinances. Short title. Construction.

2. If any person—

(a.) except under and according to a license granted by the Inspector-General of Constabulary, throws, casts or fires or suffers to be thrown, cast or fired from out of his house, shop, lodging or habitation, or from out of any place thereto belonging, any fireworks in or into any street or any place within sixty feet of the centre of a street, or in or into any public place, or

Throwing fireworks and discharging firearms in public place, and private premises.

- (b.) Except under and according to a license granted by the Inspector-General of Constabulary, discharges or suffers to be discharged or throws or suffers to be thrown upon or in his house, shop, lodging or habitation, or upon or in any place thereto belonging, any firework, bomb or other explosive within sixty feet of the centre of any street.
- (c.) discharges or suffers to be discharged from out of his house, shop, lodging or habitation or from out of any place thereto belonging, any firearms in or into any street or any place within sixty feet of the centre of any street, or into any public place,

such person shall on conviction before a Stipendiary Justice of the Peace be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds and in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding three months.

“Street” to include harbour and public place.

3. The term “street” as defined in Section 2 of Ordinance No. 5 shall include any public place and the waters of any harbour in the Colony.
