AN ORDINANCE to amend the Mongoose Ordinance,
No. 123.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Mongoose Ordinance 1908, and shall be read as one with the Mongoose Ordinance No. 123. Short title.

2. No person shall keep or have in his possession any live Mongoose. Mongoose not to be kept.

3. Any person contravening the provisions of Section 2 hereof shall be guilty of an offence, and on summary conviction thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding three months. Penalty.

4. Any Justice of the Peace who is satisfied by proof on oath that there is reasonable cause for believing that there Search warrant.

is in any house, building, premises or other place any Mongoose, may issue a warrant under his hand authorizing some member of the Constabulary Force named therein to enter and search such house, building, premises or other place for such Mongoose.

Every such warrant may be issued and executed on a Sunday.
