AN ORDINANCE to amend the Explosives Ordinance, 1907, No. 15-1907.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Explosives (Amend- Short title. ment) Ordinance 1908. It shall be read as one with the Explosives Ordinance 1907 (15-1907), hereinafter called the principal Ordinance. The principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may together be cited as the Explosives Ordinances, 1907 and 1908.

2. It shall be lawful for any member of the Constabulary Inspection of stock and books. Force, at any time when such premises are open for business, to enter the premises of any person licensed as a wholesale dealer or a retail dealer under the principal Ordinance, and to inspect all explosives in the stock of such dealer and the receptacles in which the same may be stored, and also to inspect the books kept by any such dealer under Sections 16 and 34 of the said Ordinance, and to take a copy of any entries in any of such books.

Any such dealer who refuses to allow such inspection to be made or copy to be taken, or obstructs any member of the Constabulary Force while making such inspection or taking such copy, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance, and on summary conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding three months.
