AN ORDINANCE to remove certain doubts with regard to the appointment of Quintin Herbert Spicer to the Office of Sub-Registrar of the Supreme Court in San Fernando.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. The appointment by letter dated the ninth day of January 1907 and signed by Hugh Clifford, Colonial Secretary of this Colony, by virtue whereof the said Quintin Herbert Spicer acted as Sub-Registrar of the Supreme Court in San Fernando from the seventeenth day of February 1907, until the eighteenth day of July 1908, shall for all purposes be deemed and taken to have been duly made by letters patent under the public Seal of the Colony under the provisions of Section 9 of the Judicature Ordinance No. 34.

2. No judgment or order signed or entered up by the said Quintin Herbert Spicer nor any other act of the said Quintin Herbert Spicer shall be deemed in any way invalid or illegal or wanting in binding force or effect by reason of the appointment of the said Quintin Herbert Spicer having been made by letter as aforesaid, or of such appointment being deficient or alleged to be deficient in any words or other formality alleged to be requisite to constitute the same letters patent within the meaning of the said Section.
