AN ORDINANCE to amend the Roads Ordinance
No. 200.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Roads Ordinance 1908. It shall be read as one with the Roads Ordinance No. 200, the Roads (Amending) Ordinance No. 288, and the Roads (Amendment) Ordinance 1905 (25-1905).

2. It shall be lawful for the Central Road Board, whenever it shall deem it advisable, to investigate any complaint made against a Local Road Board and to enquire into the conduct and management of any such Board and the expenditure of the funds thereof and the conduct of any member or officer of such Board, and to report thereon and make recommendations with respect thereto to the Governor.

All such investigations and enquiries shall be deemed to be enquiries under the Commissions of Enquiry Ordinance No. 119, and the Central Road Board shall in conducting the same have all the duties, powers and authorities of Commissioners appointed under the said Ordinance.

The provisions of the said Ordinance with respect to witnesses shall apply to all persons summoned to attend and give evidence or to produce books plans or documents at such investigations and enquiries.

3. The Central Road Board may delegate the powers conferred upon it by Section 2 hereof to such Committee or Committees of its members as it may by resolution appoint. Delegation of powers.
