AN ORDINANCE to amend the Ordinance No. 6 of 1870,
entitled "An Ordinance with regard to Education."

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Education Short title.
(Scholarships) Ordinance, 1903."

2. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st Commence-
day of January, 1904. ment.

3. Section 29 of the Ordinance No. 6 of 1870 is hereby Repeal.
repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

29. (1.) In each year, from and after the commence- Scholarships.
ment of this Ordinance, three exhibitions of the value of
£600 each shall be granted to students of the Royal College
who shall have passed such examination as the Council of
the College may have appointed. Such exhibitions shall be

applied towards the maintenance of such students at some University, and shall be payable in such instalments at such times and shall be subject to such regulations as the Council of the College may from time to time prescribe.

(2.) In this section the term "University" means:—

- (a.) Any University in any part of His Majesty's Dominions; or
- (b.) Any University outside His Majesty's Dominions approved by the Council of the College; or
- (c.) Any recognized educational institution or College within or without His Majesty's Dominions approved by the said Council.

Repeal.

4. The Ordinances Nos. 7 of 1886 and 24 of 1894 are hereby repealed.

Passed in Council this Second day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three.
