AN ORDINANCE to amend the law with respect to the sale of Milk.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short title.      1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ The Sale of Milk Ordinance, 1902,” and shall be read together with the Sale of Milk Ordinance 1894 (27-1894), and the Public Health Ordinance, 1869 (16-1869).

Regulations.      2. The General Board of Health may at their discretion issue regulations under Section 3 of the said Ordinance No. 27-1894 for the following additional purposes or any of them, that is to say :—

(a.) In any district to be defined in such regulations to provide for the issue to cowkeepers, dairymen and other persons vending milk of licenses to carry on such business, and to vend, hawk for sale or deliver milk to consumers, and for the issue of badges for persons actually vending or

carrying milk to customers on behalf of such licensed persons.

- (b.) To compel all persons within any district so proclaimed selling or delivering milk to carry and exhibit when lawfully thereto required badges denoting the issue of such licenses, to be supplied as in Sub-section (a.) provided.
- (c.) To charge such fees in respect of the issue of such licenses and badges as may by such regulations be prescribed, to be paid to the Sanitary Inspector for the district on behalf of the Board.
- (d.) To impose penalties not exceeding in any case five pounds for offences against such regulations.

Passed in Council this ninth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two.
