AN ORDINANCE to amend the Law relating to Petroleum.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Petroleum Ordinance 1902. It shall be read as one with the Petroleum Ordinance 1895 (29-1895), hereinafter called the principal Ordinance.

Construction.

License to sell crude petroleum.

2. Notwithstanding anything in Section 20 of the principal Ordinance contained, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to empower a Justice to grant under Section 10 of the said Ordinance to any person named by the Governor a license to sell or expose or keep for sale or have in possession on premises to be approved by the Governor any crude petroleum, whether or not the same be dangerous petroleum within the meaning of the principal Ordinance.

Shipping and storage.

3. It shall be lawful for the Governor under the provisions of Section 4 of the principal Ordinance and of this section

to prescribe special conditions as to any license, respecting the places where and the manner in which any such crude petroleum may be shipped landed received deposited guarded delivered or removed, as distinguished from petroleum which is not dangerous; and also to make regulations respecting the storage treatment refining and manufacture from such crude petroleum of refined petroleum oil for illuminating and other purposes.

4. The provisions of Section 3 of the said Ordinance shall be deemed to apply to every vessel carrying a cargo of petroleum and loaded in any harbour within the Colony for carriage either coastwise or for exportation. ^{Regulation of vessels.}

5. The export duties on Petroleum crude, distilled and distilled and refined authorized by the Ordinance No. 14 of 1885 are hereby repealed as from the first of July 1902; and Section 3 of the said Ordinance shall be read as if all provisions for collecting such duties had been omitted therefrom. ^{Export duties.}
