AN ORDINANCE relating to the powers of the Deputy Registrar-General.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Real Property Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance 1905. It shall be read as one with the Real Property Ordinance, No. 60.

2. Whenever by any law for the time being in force in this Colony anything is appointed to be done by the Registrar-General, the same may be lawfully and for all purposes effectually done by any Deputy Registrar-General. Powers of Deputy Registrar-General. Provided that no Deputy Registrar-General shall unless a Barrister-at-Law or a Solicitor and Conveyancer, act as Examiner of Titles. Provided nevertheless that nothing herein contained shall prevent the appointment of any Deputy Registrar-General who is not a Barrister-at-Law or

a Solicitor and Conveyancer to act as Registrar-General in the absence of the Registrar-General on leave or otherwise, provided that he shall not act as Examiner of Titles.

Passed in Council this Fourth day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and five.
