AN ORDINANCE to amend the Port-of-Spain Corporation
Ordinance, Cap. 224.

[15th November, 1930.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Port-of-Spain
Corporation (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1931, and shall
Construction. be read as one with the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance,
Cap. 224, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment
of s. 16 (3) of
Cap. 224. 2. Sub-section (3) of section 16 of the Principal
Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words
“and other” after the word “travelling” in the first line
of the sub-section.

3. Section 16 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of a new sub-section, to be numbered (4), to read as follows:—

(4) The Mayor shall receive an honorarium of £500 per annum payable out of the ordinary revenues of the Corporation by equal monthly instalments at the end of each month.

4. This Ordinance shall operate retrospectively and shall be deemed to have commenced on the fifteenth day of November, 1930.
