AN ORDINANCE to amend the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance.

[29th March, 1926.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, and shall be read as one with the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

4.—(1) No person shall work any apparatus for wireless telegraphy installed on:—

Ships and
aircraft.

(a) any ship whilst that ship is in the territorial waters of the Colony, or

- (b) any aircraft whilst that aircraft is in or over the Colony or the territorial waters thereof, otherwise than in accordance with regulations made in that behalf by the Governor in Executive Council.
- (2) Such regulations shall be published in the *Royal Gazette*.
- (3) Any person contravening, or permitting, procuring, or assisting in the contravention of, any such regulation shall be liable, on summary conviction before a Magistrate, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding six months.
- (4) This section shall not apply to ships or aircraft in His Majesty's Service.
