AN ORDINANCE to amend the San Fernando Electric Works Ordinance.

[9th December, 1926.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the San Fernando Short title. Electric Works (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, and shall Construction. be read as one with the San Fernando Electric Works Cap. 231. Ordinance, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of s. 2 of Cap. 231. amended by the addition thereto of the following definitions :—

“ Appropriate meter ” means a meter of a pattern approved by an Inspector ;

“Certified meter” means an appropriate meter certified by an Inspector to be correct within such limits of error as may be prescribed.

3. Section 34 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “duly certified under the provisions of this Ordinance” at the end thereof.

Amendment
of s. 36 of
Cap. 231.

4. Section 36 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the words “if required by the consumer shall” after the word “and” in the seventh line.

Rules and
Regulations.

5. Section 47 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

47. (1) After first communicating with the Council and taking into consideration any representations made by them, the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations:—

(a) respecting the supply of electrical energy, for:—

(i) The securing of the safety of the public from personal injury, or from fire, or otherwise; and

(ii) The securing of a regular supply of electricity; and

(iii) The authorizing of inspection and enquiry from time to time; and

(iv) The enforcement of the due performance of the duties of the Council under the provisions of this Ordinance.

(b) for providing for any matters which are authorized by this Ordinance to be prescribed.

(2) All such rules and regulations shall be published in the *Royal Gazette*.

Passed in Council this twenty-sixth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.
